Participatory Budget

Our young people are involved and contributing in a meaningful way to our PEF planning through collaboration and decision making to agree how some (£3000 approx) of our PEF budget is allocated and used to improve outcomes for all.

Transitions

Our Pupil Support Worker (P7-S1 Transition) will be based in both Broxburn Academy and in each of our 4 cluster primaries. They will work with a targeted group of P7 pupils to build relationships, gather transition information and support transition visits to the High school. Post-summer they will be based in the Academy so they can support the same young people in classes and around the school as they settle in to the High school environment.

Breakfast Club

Breakfast club runs daily from 8am.

Young people can get breakfast in school and have a daily check-in with support staff before the start of the school day.

Broxburn Achieve

Our Broxburn Achieve teacher will work with a targeted group of young people who are at risk of not achieving a minimum of 5 qualifications by the end of S4. Supporting attainment outcomes for these young people whilst also supporting increased levels of attendance and engagement to ensure they achieve a minimum of 5 qualifications ranging from National 3, 4 & 5 which include a Literacy and Numeracy qualification.

Wellbeing Hub

We will employ a teacher who will establish an additional nurture space in the form of a Wellbeing hub for young people with social, emotional and behaviour needs that provides an alternative curriculum pathway that develops resilience, builds confidence, improves self esteem and supports them to better manage peer relationships.
